## COURSE OF INSTRUCTION

### Barber – 1000 Hour Course

**Location:** 2500 New Stine Road Suite 203, Bakersfield, CA 93309

**Hours/Length:** 1,000 clocked hours (approximately 6 1/2 months)

**Daily Schedule:** Tuesday through Friday, 9:00 am to 6:00 pm

**Saturday Schedule:** Saturday, 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

**Pre-requisites:** Completion of 10th grade and a minimum test score of 70%

**Course Description:** Students enrolled in will complete 1,000 hours of technical instruction and practical training encompassing all barbering practices, as required by Section 7316 of the Barbering and Cosmetology Act.

**Graduation Requirements:** To successfully complete this program, students must fulfill all prescribed coursework and achieve a grade of C or higher.

### Course Outline

#### Barbering Course Minimum Requirements

Business and Professions Code (B&P) section 7362.5(a) requires that any course in barbering or cosmetology established by a school must consist of at least 1,000 hours of practical and technical instruction in the practice of barbering or cosmetology.

1. **100 hours dedicated to Health and Safety**, including instruction on hazardous substances, chemical safety, safety data sheets, protection from hazardous chemicals, prevention of chemical injuries, health and safety laws and regulations, and communicable disease prevention
2. **250 hours focused on Disinfection and Sanitation**, covering procedures to protect the health and safety of both consumers and technicians, as well as proper disinfection methods for equipment used in establishments. **(Includes 125 total disinfection and sanitation operations.)**
3. **200 hours on Chemical Hair Services**, providing instruction in coloring, straightening, waving, bleaching, hair analysis, predisposition and strand tests, safety precautions, formula mixing, and the use of dye removers. **(Includes 125 total chemical service operations.)**
4. **200 hours on Hairstyling Services:** Including arranging, blow drying, cleansing, curling, dressing, hair analysis, shampooing, waving, nonchemical straightening, and hair cutting with shears, razors, electrical clippers and trimmers, and thinning shears for both wet and dry cutting. **(Includes 125 total hairstyling operations.)**

5. **250 hours dedicated to Shaving and Beard Trimming:** Includes instruction on preparing the client's hair for shaving, evaluating skin condition, performing various shaving techniques, applying aftershave antiseptic following facial services, and providing facial massage and cream massage procedures. **(Includes 50 total shaving operations.)**

**Barber Crossover (For Cosmetologist) – 400 Hour Course**

**Location:** 2500 New Stine Road Suite 203, Bakersfield, CA 93309

**Hours/Length:** 400 clocked hours (approximately 11 ½ months)

**Daily Schedule:** Wednesdays, 9:00 am to 6:00 pm

**Pre-requisites:** Current Driver's License or Identification Card and a valid Cosmetology License

**Course Description:** Students enrolled in will complete 400 hours of technical instruction and practical operations covering those cosmetology practices not included in the required training or practice of a barber, as outlined in Section 7316 of the Barbering and Cosmology Act.

**Graduation Requirements:** To successfully complete this program, students must fulfill all prescribed coursework and earn a grade of C or higher.

The curriculum for students enrolled in a cosmetology crossover course for barbers shall consist of a minimum of four hundred (400) clock hours of Technical instruction and practical operations covering those cosmetology practices that are not a part of the required training or practice of a barber.

**Hours/Length:** 1000 Clocked Hours (6 1/2 months)

**Daily Schedule:** Tue - Fri 9:00 am to 12:00 and 1:00 to 6:00 pm

**Saturday Schedule:** Sat 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

**Pre-requisites:** Completed 10th grade, Test with the minimum score of 70%.

**Course Description:** Students enrolled in will complete 1,000 hours of technical instruction and practical training, covering all aspects of barbering as required by Section CCR 961(b)(2) of the Barbering and Cosmology Act.

**Graduation Requirements:** To complete this program, a student must fulfill all prescribed coursework and earn a grade of C or higher.

## **Course Outline**

Cosmetology Course Minimum Requirements Business and Professions Code (B&P) section 7362.5(a) states: "A course in barbering or cosmetology established by a school shall consist of not less than 1,000 hours of practical and technical instruction in the practice of barbering or cosmetology..."

**(1) 100 hours dedicated to Health and Safety:** Includes instruction on hazardous substances, chemical safety, safety data sheets, protection from hazardous chemicals, prevention of chemical injuries, health and safety laws and regulations, and communicable disease prevention

**(2) 200 hours focused on Disinfection and Sanitation:** Covers procedures to protect the health and safety of both consumers and technicians, as well as proper disinfection methods for equipment used in establishments.

**125 total disinfection and sanitation operations.**

**(3) 200 hours on Chemical Hair Services:** Provides instruction in coloring, straightening, waving, bleaching, hair analysis, predisposition and strand tests, safety precautions, formula mixing, and the use of dye removers.

**125 total chemical service operations**

**(4) 200 hours on Hairstyling Services:** Includes instruction on arranging, blow drying, cleansing, curling, dressing, hair analysis, shampooing, waving, nonchemical straightening, and hair cutting with shears, razors, electrical clippers and trimmers, and thinning shears for both wet and dry cutting.

**125 total hairstyling operations**

**(5) 150 hours on Skin Care:** Covers chemical and manual facials, massaging, stimulating, exfoliating, cleansing, or beautifying the face, scalp, neck, or body using hands, esthetic devices, cosmetic products, antiseptics, lotions, tonics, or creams that do not result in the ablation or destruction of live tissue. Includes 40 total operations.

**40 manual, electrical, and chemical facials**

**(6) 50 hours on Hair Removal and Lash and Brow Beautification:** Includes instruction on tinting and perming eyelashes and brows, applying eyelashes, and removing superfluous hair using depilatories, tweezers, sugaring, nonprescription chemicals, or waxing, or by devices and appliances of any kind except lasers or light waves.

**40 total hair removal and lash and brow beautification operations.**

**(7) 100 hours on Manicure and Pedicure:** Covers water and oil manicures, hand and arm massage, foot and ankle massage, nail analysis, and artificial nail services including acrylic, liquid and powder brush-on, dip, tips, wraps, and repairs. Includes

**145 total operations, with 25 manicures/pedicures and 120 nail operations.**

### **ESTHETICIAN – 600 Hour Course**

**Location:** 2500 New Stine Road Suite 203 Bakersfield Ca 93309

**Hours/Length:** 600 Clocked Hours (7 months)

**Daily Schedule:** Tue – Thurs 8:00 am to 2:00 pm  
Friday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm

**Saturday Schedule:** Sat 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

**Pre-requisites:** Completed 10th grade, Test with the minimum score of 70%.

**Course Description:** Students enrolled in this program will complete 600 hours of technical instruction and practical training, covering all practices of esthetics as required by Section CCR 961(b)(2) of the Barbering and Cosmology Act.

**Graduation Requirements:** To complete this program, a student must fulfill all prescribed coursework and earn a grade of C or higher.

### **Course Outline**

#### **Students Learning Objective**

600 hours of technical instruction and practical training in facials

**(350 hours)** Includes, but is not limited to, the following techniques and procedures: manual, electrical, and chemical facials. Manual facials cover cleansing, scientific manipulations, packs, and masks. Electrical facials involve the use of electrical

modalities, dermal lights, and electrical apparatus for facial and skin care purposes. Chemical facials include chemical skin peels, packs, masks, and scrubs.

**(140 hours)** Total operations in manual, electrical, and chemical facials

**(15 hours)** Preparation: client consultation, intake procedures, contraindications, professionalism, client record keeping, pre- and post-operative care, salon and spa skills

**(10 hours)** Laws and Regulations: The Barbering and Cosmetology Act and the Board's Rules and Regulations; technical instruction/theory

**(40 hours)** Health and Safety Considerations (including the State Board Health and Safety Curriculum): covers training in chemicals and health in establishments, material safety data sheets, protection from hazardous chemicals, prevention of chemical injuries, health and safety laws and agencies, communicable diseases (including HIV/AIDS and Hepatitis B), chemical composition and purpose of cosmetic and skin care preparation, elementary chemical makeup, chemical skin peels, physical and chemical changes of matter, electrical current, principles of operating electrical devices, and safety precautions for electrical equipment; technical instruction/theory

**(10 hours)** Disinfection and Sanitation: procedures to protect the health and safety of the consumer and technician, proper disinfection procedures, with emphasis throughout the training period; technical instruction/theory and minimum practical instruction

**(15 hours)** Technical instruction/theory in anatomy and physiology: human anatomy, human physiology, bacteriology, skin analysis, and conditions

**(25 hours)** Technical instruction in creative hair removal and make-up, including eyebrow beautification

**(50 operations)** Includes, but is not limited to: eyebrow beautification (technical instruction/theory – 15 hours; minimum practical instruction – 50 operations), 10 hair removal operations using tweezers, and 40 hair removal operations using wax

**(20 hours)** Technical instruction/theory in make-up

**(40 operations)** Make-up demonstrations

## **MANICURIST – 400 Hour Course**

**Location:** 2500 New Stine Road Suite 203 Bakersfield Ca 93309

**Hours/Length:** 400 Clocked Hours (3 months)

**Daily Schedule:** Tue – Thurs 8:00 am to 2:00 pm  
Friday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm

**Saturday Schedule:** Sat 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

**Pre-requisites:** Completed 10th grade, Test with the minimum score of 70%.

**Course Description:** Students enrolled in this program will complete a 400-hour Manicuring course designed to prepare them for the state board licensing examination. The curriculum includes hands-on training and is structured to meet California's educational requirements.

**Graduation Requirements:** To complete this program, a student must fulfill all prescribed courses and earn a grade of C or higher.

### **Course Outline**

**(300 hours)** Technical instruction and practical training in nail care.

#### **Manicures and Pedicures:**

This subject includes, but is not limited to, the following techniques and procedures: water and oil manicures with hand and arm massage, complete pedicures with foot and ankle massage, application of artificial nails including liquid, gel, and powder brush-on, nail tips, nail wraps and repairs, and nail analysis. **(60 & 180 Nails)**

**(100 hours)** Technical instruction and practical training in health and safety.

#### **Laws and Regulations:**

**(10 hours)** Hours of the subjects of Laws and Regulations shall include, but is not limited to, the following issues: The Barbering and Cosmetology Act and the Board's Rules and Regulations.

**(25 hours)** Health and Safety Considerations:

Includes chemistry related to manicurist practices, chemical composition and purpose of nail care preparations, hazardous substances, training in chemicals and health in establishments, material safety data sheets, protection from hazardous chemicals, preventing chemical injuries, health and safety laws and agencies, ergonomics, and communicable diseases including HIV/AIDS and Hepatitis B

#### **Disinfection and Sanitation:**

**(20 hours)** Covers procedures to protect the health and safety of both the consumer and the technician.

The ten required minimum operations include all necessary functions for disinfecting

instruments and equipment as specified in Sections 979 and 980. Disinfection is emphasized throughout the training period and must be performed before using all instruments and equipment, with special attention to pedicure foot spa and basin disinfection procedures detailed in Sections 980.1, 980.2, and 980.3.

**(10 hours) Anatomy and Physiology:**

Covers bacteriology, anatomy, physiology, and nail analysis and conditions.

**(25 hours) Health and Safety Course on Hazardous Substances:**

Covers hazardous substances and basic labor laws as developed pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 7389.

**(300 hours) Technical instruction and practical training in nail care.**

**Manicures and Pedicures:**

This subject includes, but is not limited to, the following techniques and procedures: water and oil manicures with hand and arm massage, complete pedicures with foot and ankle massage, application of artificial nails including liquid, gel, and powder brush-on, nail tips, nail wraps and repairs, and nail analysis. (60 & 180 Nails)

**(100 hours) Technical instruction and practical training in health and safety.**

**Laws and Regulations:**

**(10 hours) Covers the Barbering and Cosmetology Act and the Board's Rules and Regulations.**

**Hairstylist – 600 Hour Course**

**Location:** 2500 New Stine Road Suite 203 Bakersfield Ca 93309

**Hours/Length:** 600 Clocked Hours (7 months)

**Daily Schedule:** Tue – Thurs 8:00 am to 2:00 pm

Friday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm

**Saturday Schedule:** Sat 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

**Pre-requisites:** Completed 10th grade, Test with the minimum score of 70%.

**Course Description-**Students enrolled in Get Faded Barber College

Shall consist of six hundred hours of technical instruction and practical training covering all practices of a Hairstylist pursuant to Section CCR 961(b)(2) of the Barbering and Cosmology Act.

**Graduation Requirements:** To complete this program a student must complete all prescribed courses and earn a grade of C or better.

## **Course Outline**

Students Learning Objective

600 hours of Technical Instruction and Practical Training in Hairstylist

**(200 hours)** Health and Safety: Includes instruction on hazardous substances, chemical safety, safety data sheets, protection from hazardous chemicals, prevention of chemical injuries, health and safety laws and regulations, and communicable disease prevention.

**(100 hours)** Disinfection and Sanitation: Covers procedures to protect the health and safety of both the consumer and the technician. Proper disinfection methods are emphasized throughout the training period and must be performed before using any instruments or equipment. Includes technical instruction/theory and minimum practical instruction.

**(300 hours)** Hair Styling Services: Includes instruction on arranging, blow drying, cleansing, curling, dressing, hair analysis, shampooing, waving, nonchemical straightening, and hair cutting using shears, razors, electrical clippers and trimmers, and thinning shears for both wet and dry cutting.

## **GROUNDINGS FOR DENIAL OF A LICENSE**

1. A board may deny a license regulated by this code on the grounds that the applicant has one of the following: a. has been convicted of a crime. A conviction within the meaning of this section means a plea or verdict of guilt or a conviction following a plea of no contender. Any action which a board is permitted to take following the establishment of a conviction may be taken when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal, or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code. b. Done any act involving dishonesty, fraud or deceit with the intent to substantially benefit him or another, or substantially injure another; or; done any act which if done by a licentiate of the business or profession in question, would be grounds for suspension or revocation of license.

The board may deny a license pursuant to this subdivision only if the crime or act is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of the business or profession for which application is made.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE POLICIES**

Enrollment for this training will help resolve a variety of employments barriers. The program offered by Get Faded Barber College is available to individuals who are motivated and committed to improving their vocational skills level.

In order to be enrolled or admitted to his/her desired program, an applicant must provide a valid ID and have completed High School or Equivalent/GED and a Social Security or ITIN Number.

## **PROCEDURES**

Interested applicants will meet with the Chief Executive for an interview, during which a campus tour will be provided. The Chief Executive will share detailed information about the Get Faded Barber & Beauty College programs and discuss each applicant's qualifications to help determine the best path for their career objectives. To be formally admitted, all applicants must review and sign the required pre-enrollment disclosures, including the <Get Faded Barber & Beauty College Catalog>, Notice of Cancellation, School Performance Fact Sheet, and Enrollment Agreement.

Applicants who do not possess a high school diploma, certificate of proficiency, or G.E.D. must take the Combined English Language Skills Assessment (CELSA) Ability to Benefit Test, administered by an independent third party at the applicant's expense. Testing is scheduled by appointment and is separate from the initial interview. Results are communicated by phone or email. Applicants who achieve a qualifying score are eligible to enroll; those who do not may retake the CELSA test or re-test after 15 days. The qualifying score is 97.

All instruction at Get Faded Barber & Beauty College is conducted in English. Prospective students must demonstrate basic proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding English. Non-native English speakers are required to take a TABE assessment in English and achieve a comprehension level of 6.9 or higher. Some programs may have additional employment or licensing requirements beyond these basic standards.

### **“Notice Concerning the Transferability of Credits and Credentials Earned at Our Institution”**

## **RECORDS RETENTION**

Admissions data and student's records are kept for five years from the last day of student attendance. Students wishing to view or obtain copies of their school records need to contact Get Faded Barber & Beauty College Administrative Office to make arrangements. ### **DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE**

## **ATTENDANCE POLICY**

Students are expected to attend scheduled classes at all the scheduled starting times and to continue as scheduled throughout the day. Students will be expected to attend classes as they would attend work if they were employed. All absences and tardiness are recorded. It is the responsibility of the student to telephone the school in advance to advise their instructor that they will be absent or late, as it would be necessary to inform an employer.

Certificates of perfect attendance are awarded to those students who complete training with no unexcused absences.

## **PROBATION AND DISMISSAL POLICY**

### **Probation**

A student may be placed on probation for the following reasons:

1. Failure to follow Student Conduct Policy.
2. Failure to meet satisfactory academic progress.

Probation indicates that a student may continue participation in the course under certain conditions for a specific period of time, not to exceed one year.

When a student is placed under probation, a conference is scheduled with the student, administration, and any faculty concerned to determine the requirement that must be met for the students to continue in the program. A specific timetable is set for meeting those requirements.

If the student is unable to rectify the problems discussed during the counseling session, they will be placed on a one-week suspension. If the problem should arise again, the student will be dismissed from the school.

### **Dismissal Policy**

Get Faded Barber & Beauty College reserves the right to dismiss any student that does not comply with any school policy at the school function. Re-entrance may be accepted if a student can demonstrate that the conditions causing the situation has been resolved.

### **DROPOUT AND LEAVE-OF-ABSENCE POLICY**

Students with extenuating circumstances that anticipate being absent for more than 10 consecutive days can apply for a leave of absence. In Order to request a leave of absence, please provide prior written notification to your instructor must be signed and dated with specific reason for leave. Under no circumstances may a student exceed 90 days' leave of absence time. Approval of leaves of absence shall be at the discretion of Get Faded Barber & Beauty College Executive included new expected completion date. You have the right to withdraw from a course of instruction at any time. Get Faded Barber College encourages you to discuss any problems that may be affecting your continued participation with your Get Faded Barber College Instructor.

### **RE-ADMISSION**

Following a Leave of Absence upon return from leave, the student will be required to repeat the modules or class, if it had been interrupted, and receive final grades. The student will not be charged any fee for the repeat of any module or class from which the student took leave or for students returning from a leave of absence. The date the student returns to class is normally scheduled for the beginning of a class or module. When a student is enrolled in a modular program, the student may return at any appropriate module, not only the module from which the student withdrew.

### **PROGRESS/GRADING SYSTEM / STUDENT TO TEACHER RATIO**

Get Faded Barber & Beauty College training courses are based on a set number of competencies that a student must demonstrate through written tests and/or hands on performance. Students must successfully complete all prescribed competencies detailed in the training curriculum with a 70% or greater. Evaluation of students' achievement will be based on meeting the objectives for each class. Grade reports are issued to students at the completion of each competency. Grades are based on the quality of

work as shown by written tests, Particulate work, and projects as indicated on the course syllabus. The grading scale is as follows:

Get Faded Barber & Beauty College completes monthly student performance evaluation for all students. Monthly evaluations summarize participant's grades, attendance, and progress in meetings training expectations, perceived learning problems and projected progress to be made in the next month. Monthly performance is discussed with students.

**Student to Instructor Ratio:**

Theory classes maintain a student-to-instructor ratio of 30 to 1.

Practical training sessions maintain a student-to-instructor ratio of 16 to 1.

**CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION**

Students successfully completing the course of Barbering/Cosmetology/Nail Tech or Esthetician will be awarded a Certificate of Completion attesting to his/her successful completion of the program.

**STUDENT CONDUCT POLICY**

At the discretion of the school administration, a student may be dismissed from school for serious incident or repeated incident of the following: an intoxicated or drug state of behavior; possession of drugs or alcohol upon school premises; possession of weapons upon school premises; behavior creating a safety hazard to other persons at the school; disobedient or disrespectful behavior to another student, administrator, Instructor, or other stated or determined infraction of conduct.

Students have an obligation to put forth the effort needed to reach their training goals and maintain a high standard of behavior throughout their participation in Get Faded Barber & Beauty College program.

Students are required to practice honesty when preparing attendance and financial forms and when completing tests, examinations, class assignments and other tasks.

### **TUITION POLICY** **CANCELLATION OF ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT**

You have the right to cancel this agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid though attendance at the first class or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. (except for Veterans. With a cancellation within 40 days from the date of enrollment, Veterans will receive 100% reimbursement). This includes course tuition and includes any equipment such as books, materials, and supplies or any other goods related to the instruction offered in this Agreement. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation at the address of the school shown on top and in front of this agreement. You can do this by mail properly addressed with prepaid postage. The

written notice of cancellation need not take any form and however expressed. It is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by this Agreement.

### **REFUND POLICY**

After the cancellation period, the institution provides a pro-rate refund of ALL funds paid for tuition charges to students who have completed 60% or less of the period of attendance. Once more than 60% of the enrollment period in the entire course has elapsed (including absences), there will be no refund to the student. This policy applies to all students. ### **STUDENT TUITION RECOVERY FUND**

**(Effective April 1, 2024, the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) assessment rate will change from two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of institutional charges to zero dollars (\$0.00) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of institutional charges. (5, CCR section 76120). Institutions will still be required to complete and submit all STRF Assessment Reporting Forms on a quarterly basis and maintain specified student information for STRF-eligible students.)**

“The State of California established the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) to relieve or mitigate economic loss suffered by a student in an educational program at a qualifying institution, who is or was a California resident while enrolled, or was enrolled in a residency program, if the student enrolled in the institution, prepaid tuition, and suffered an economic loss. Unless relieved of the obligation to do so, you must pay the state-imposed assessment for the STRF, or it must be paid on your behalf, if you are a student in an educational program, who is a California resident, or are enrolled in a residency program, and prepay all or part of your tuition. You are not eligible for protection from the STRF, and you are not required to pay the STRF assessment, if you are not a California resident, or are not enrolled in a residency program.”

“It is important that you keep copies of your enrollment agreement, financial aid documents, receipts, or any other information that documents the amount paid to the school. Questions regarding the STRF may be directed to the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, 1747 North Market Blvd., Suite 225, Sacramento, California, 95834, (916) 574-8900 or (888) 370-7589.

To be eligible for STRF, you must be a California resident or are enrolled in a residency program, prepaid tuition, paid or deemed to have paid the STRF assessment, and suffered an economic loss as a result of any of the following:

1. The institution, the location of the institution, or an educational program offered by the institution was closed or discontinued, and you did not choose to participate in a teach-out plan approved by the Bureau or did not complete a chosen teach-out plan approved by the Bureau.
2. You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution within the 120-day period before the closure of the institution or location of the institution or were enrolled in an educational program within the 120-day period before the program was discontinued.
3. You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution more than 120 days before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, in an educational program offered by the institution as to which the Bureau determined there was a significant decline in the quality or value of the program more than 120 days before closure.
4. The institution has been ordered to pay a refund by the Bureau but has failed to do so.
5. The institution has failed to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federal student loan program as required by law or has failed to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the institution more than tuition and other costs.
6. You have been awarded restitution, a refund, or other monetary award by an arbitrator or court, based on a violation of this chapter by an institution or representative of an institution, but have been unable to collect the award from the institution.
7. You sought legal counsel that resulted in the cancellation of one or more of your student loans and have an invoice for services rendered and evidence of the cancellation of the student loan or loans.

To qualify for STRF reimbursement, the application must be received within four (4) years from the date of the action or event that made the student eligible for recovery from STRF.

A student whose loan is revived by a loan holder or debt collector after a period of non-collection may, at any time, file a written application for recovery from STRF for the debt that would have otherwise been eligible for recovery. If it has been more than four (4) years since the action or event that made the student eligible, the student must have filed a written application for recovery within the original four (4) year period, unless the period has been extended by another act of law.

However, no claim can be paid to any student without a social security number or a taxpayer identification number.

The Registration Barber License will be granted by the Barbering and Cosmetology Board only after the student has successfully completed and graduated from either of the barber courses described previously and passed the Barber Examination with an overall average score of 75%

## **JOB CLASSIFICATIONS**

**Barber ( 39-5011: (5, CCR §74112 (d)(3)-** Provide barbering services, such as cutting, trimming, shampooing, and styling hair; trimming beards; or giving shaves.

**Cosmetology (39-5012: (5, CCR §74112 (d)(3)-** Provide beauty services, such as cutting, coloring, and styling hair, and massaging and treating scalp. May shampoo hair, apply makeup, dress wigs, remove hair, and provide nail and skincare services. Excludes “Makeup Artists, Theatrical and Performance” (39-5091), “Manicurists and Pedicurists” (39-5092), and “Skincare Specialists” (39-5094).

**Manicurist (39-5092: (5, CCR §74112 (d)(3)-** Clean and shape customers’ fingernails and toenails. May polish or decorate nails.

**Esthetician (39-5094: (5, CCR §74112 (d)(3)-** Skincare Specialists  
Provide skincare treatments for face and body to enhance an individual’s appearance. Includes electrologists and laser hair removal specialists.

## **STUDENTS RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**
